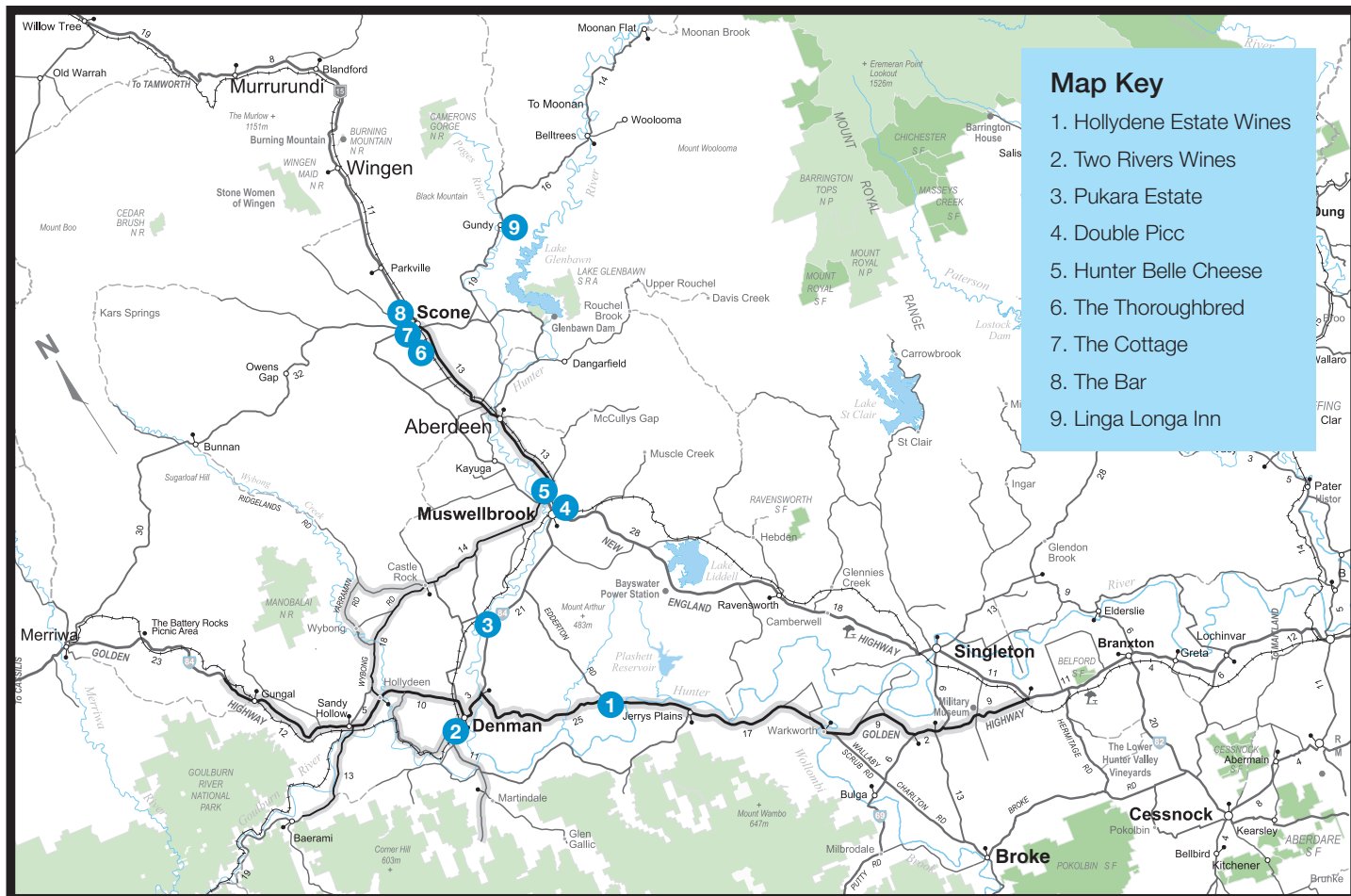

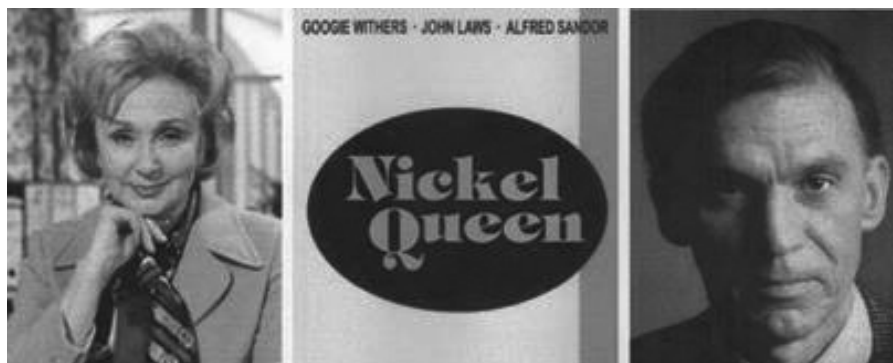

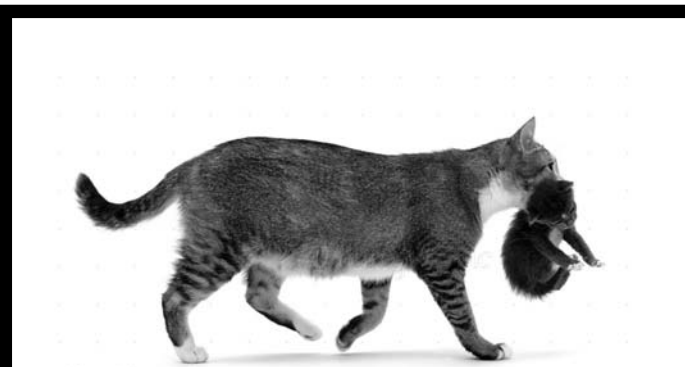

Dental Disease

I know vets talk a lot about dental disease in pets, but it really is a hidden problem that owners underestimate. It can leave your pet in serious pain whilst you think you are giving them the best care.

I only know this as I recently has a nasty surprise with my cat Mish. Mish came to live with us 13 years ago as a small kitten who had been savaged by 2 large dogs. She is quite aloof, but a much loved member of our family. She was recently unwell and I had to treat her with some antibiotics. When giving the tablets I noticed smelly breath and an intense pain reaction after I touched her mouth. Mish had been otherwise totally well, and even when watching closely I couldn't see a problem with her eating her food. I took her down to the vet clinic as soon as I was able, and discovered to my horror Type 3 resorbion on both her major chewing teeth meaning they were painful, ulcerated and needed extracting.

I check my animals regularly, feed the best food and am a vet. I missed the development of this painful condition over the last 6 months, and it took a general anaesthetic and Xrays to diagnose the problem. Please book in for a free Dental check, dental disease can be easy to miss, worsens rapidly and is intensely painful for your precious pet.

Seeking Upper Hunter Wildlife Aid carers with release sites for kangaroos and wallabies

Wildlife Aid is seeking new members who are passionate about Australian wildlife and live in the Upper Hunter region (Singleton, Muswellbrook and Upper Hunter shires) who are able to care for macropods and provide a suitable 'soft release site' for Eastern Grey Kangaroos, Red Necked Wallabies and Swamp Wallabies.

Typically, when a macropod reaches 3 to 4kg it needs to reside at a site where there are carers who can feed 2 to 3 times a day, and provide peaceful enclosures for animals of different ages which are safe from predators such as foxes, wild and domestic dogs, and traffic. The commitment to each joey can be up to 6 months depending on site and size of mob. As each joey gets older, feeding requirements become less demanding and it becomes more independent and is eventually released.

Wildlife Aid have been rescuing, rehabilitating and releasing Australian wildlife in the Upper Hunter region (from Singleton, through to Merriwa and Murrurundi) for over twenty years. They are a not-for-profit organisation that relies heavily on donations and grants. Members

who offer a release site must live in the Upper Hunter as rehabilitated animals need to be released back into the environment that Wildlife Aid are licensed to protect.

Membership is \$20 a year which includes a license to care for Australian wildlife, and insurance for any incidents that may occur while conducting wildlife care duties. Members have access to training, mentorship and subsidised feed. Members must be 18 years old or over.

New members without a release site also provide value to the group and are welcome to join. They may support the 24/7 hotline, help with fundraising and administration, rescue and care for other species such as wombats, possums, birds, bats and reptiles.



A membership form can be downloaded from www.wildlifeaid.org.au. Each membership application is assessed by the committee and release sites are inspected by experienced members for suitability.
